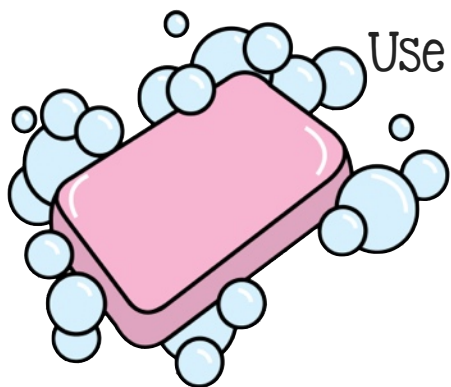


“oa”, “ow” and “oe” make the long o sound

Use “oa” mostly in the middle and sometimes at the beginning of a word

Use “ow” mostly at the end and sometimes in the beginning or middle of a word

Use “oe” at the end of a word
